## DONATIONS

We are delighted to have recently received another large donation of £250 from Holy Trinity Church and we would like to thank all those involved in raising this large amount. We have also received £157 from Callie Marks in Bristol who raised this from donations and serving refreshments at a `front room` art trail event where a group of artists opened their homes to the public for viewing their work. Callie estimates that around 1000 people attended!

## NIGERIAN SCHOOL TEACHERS

We are very grateful to Christine Higgins who is kindly donating £30 per month towards teachers salaries at our school in Oron, Nigeria. This will enable us to employ professional teachers from Nigerian universities. Under a national assistance scheme these graduates are required to work in local schools for one year. Accommodation and monthly allowances are provided by the school. If at the end of the year they prove satisfactory and they like the school then there is the option of a permanent position.

## HOUSING PROJECT

*Our housing project in Chengannur continues under the expert guidance of Jacob and our 30<sup>th</sup> house is nearing completion. This is Jacobs initial report on the plight of the selected family:*

“ASHA and PRASANNA KUMAR & family’s dream for a long time is to have a roof over their head. They are going through difficult times. They have a small plot of land of their own but they live in a tiny thatched hut attached to the house of Prasanna’s brother. (see photo). They have a daughter Anchu aged 10 and son Prasanth aged 5. About 2 years back, Prasanna became ill and was vomiting blood and since then is not able to do hard work. He used to be a daily labourer.

They get very scared in the rains and wind for fear of their hut falling apart. So on nights like that they sleep in their neighbour’s house. The children get very scared of this situation. They do not receive any help from their relatives who themselves are daily labourers finding it difficult to bring up their own families. Asha goes around selling small packets of spices in the neighbourhood and the small margin that she gets is their only income. They are in no position to build a house of their own. Hence their request to the Trust. For sure it is a needy family and their need is a genuine one.”



Jacob is also using funds to pay for repairs on houses that are in a dangerous condition and in desperate need of weatherproofing before the monsoons set in. By doing this we are also spreading the benefits further within the community.

*Earlier in the year Jacob was also approached by a lady, Thankamma Varghese, to see if we could help her with the construction of a small cattle shed. She lives alone and has no regular income but had been offered a cow by her church provided she had a shed ready. Jacob agreed this was a deserving case as we try not to just offer money but a means of helping people support themselves or to give them a better standard of living.*

### **MEETING OF SPONSORED FAMILIES IN CHENGANNUR**

Around the time of our last newsletter Jacob asked all the sponsored families to attend a meeting so they could get a better understanding of the Trust and to give Jacob a chance to explain the efforts he and supporters put in to help them and how they can build up the personal rapport that we try and encourage. About 140 people attended and this shows the respect given to the Trust and particularly Jacob and his family. Many of the families (after initial shyness) spoke some words of thanks for the help given by Jacob, their sponsors and the Trust. Some children also performed some songs and hymns and the meeting ended with tea and some refreshments.
