SUPPORTERS VISIT CHENGANNUR

This year we have had many supporters visit Chengannur. ... Here is an account of one such visit by Juliet Chaplin M.B.E....

With a couple of friends, I spent several very enjoyable days staying with Jacob, Deepa and Lilly (Jacobs Mother) at the end of January. The first big event was the handing over of the 36th house built by the Trust to the family who would live in it – although the house was not quite finished it was a very happy occasion and the new owners were much looking forward to having their own place. The house is well-built and attractive as are all the Trust houses. Then I had the pleasure of seeing Robin, whom I have been sponsoring for some years, and his widowed mother; Robin is now seventeen and training as an electrician. Before going to college he does a paper-round and he also does paid work in some of the evenings, for the telephone company. His brother is training as automobile mechanic so isn't paid much; but when both of them have qualified life will become easier. Their mother suffers from diabetes so the limited family income has to pay for her medication. I was also delighted to see Selvaraj, whom I sponsored for a few years in the 1990s and who is now a goldsmith; he is tall and very presentable and brought me a beautiful silver chain which he had made.

One afternoon we visited a local school where the children sang and danced for us, Deepa judged the

contestants, prizes were given and there was tea for all the children afterwards. The local Hindu temple, which was nearby, was persuaded to switch off its amplified broadcasts for an hour so as not to drown out the performers and their music! Jacob took us to many other interesting places, and indeed made most of our travel arrangements including overnight train journeys, internal flights, and accommodation in excellent hotels in Chennai, Varkala, Bangalore and Calcutta. So he is now a seasoned tour operator, and we were three very satisfied customers. It is always a great pleasure to stay at

the Indo-American Club (Jacob's home)'.

TSUNAMI EARTHQUAKE AND REGENERATION FUND

This is the fund we set up following the Asian Tsunami with a view to give longer term aid. The most recent aid that we have given is to send £200 to enable local women to buy equipment and set up a project to make rope from coir (coconut fibre). We are keeping this fund open until the end of this year.

CAMEROON SCHOOL

Despite the disappointment of not being able to open the school building when originally planned we are now expecting it to be ready, at least in part, so that it can be used at the start of the school year in September. The delay was due to lack of funds to meet increased costs including government requirement to register as a primary and nursery school. Richard has started lessons for children in his own house. He reports that they are enthusiastic and excited and loving their lessons.

HOLY TRINITY SALE (Bromley)

We were delighted to again be given a stall at the HT Church sale in June. As well as taking some money from sales and donations the Church and their charity committee both gave us large donations to help towards our work. We have divided this money between two of our school projects in Nigeria and Cameroon. This money will be used towards opening the new building in Cameroon so it can hopefully be used at the beginning of the school year in September. In Nigeria the school will use the money to finish the boundary wall and gates to make the place safe and secure for the children. We would again like to thank all those at HT for their generous and kind help.
